BUT if you weren't able to get over to Japan to see or hear it......keep an "ear" open for PUSA songs in some upcoming shows......the knew theme song for the Drew Carey show (the remake of Ian Hunter's "Cleveland Rocks") and their cover of "Video Killed the Radio Star" in Adam Sandler's new movie "The Wedding Singer". The Guys will also be appearing on a Kiss compilation, and will be writing the theme song to an upcoming movie called "The President's Daughter." Plus, the guys are gearing up to make a third album when they come back from tour! We'll keep you posted on the tenative Summer '98 release!

Whew! Finally, the band has slowed down enough to tell us all the stuff they've been doing for the past year!

Obviously, you all know about "II" that was released on Election day last year, but did you know that the album went GOLD in the United States and DOULBLE PLATINUM in Australia?! And did you know that the day their album came out, they played on Politically Incorrect for the Presidential countdown? Yes, the boys have been quite busy these days. To promote their album the guys did a U.S. tour with Custard and Redd Kross opening for them, as well as performing at the KROQ (L.A's Alternative Radio Station) "Acoustic X-mas" with several bands including Republica, Bush, 311, Beck, The Wallflowers, Cake and more! A couple of months later, PUSA played with Tom Petty at the famous San Francisco Filmore, and later performed with "The Captain" (from the 70's group, The Capt. And Tenile) on the premiere of the Jenny McCarthy show on MTV.

In April, Chris and his wife, Mary Lynn, had a beautiful baby boy named Augustus William Ballew. More happy news arrived when PUSA received another Grammy nomination for "Peaches". 

At the beginning of August, they played a private party at Sony Pictures Studios in Los Angeles, BUT someone at the party forgot to get a permit to play loud music after 10pm, and the band had to stop playing in the middle of their set, or get arrested! As the police started to surround the party, the crowd went crazy and started chanting "BULLSHIT!" What a night!








### Here's a letter from Dave to you!

Hey PUSA People:

Just a quick note to let you know what we've been up to the last few months.

The summer has been fairly relaxed in terms of touring. We've played a bunch of state and county fairs and a few other strange little gigs. Just a few weeks ago we played at a party for Sony pictures and, for the first time in our careers, got shut down halfway through a set. We were playing outdoors in the parking lot at Sony's L.A. studios, and the cops came and pulled the plug after four or five songs. Seems unlikely — one would think Sony would have dealt with all this beforehand. But they had failed to get the appropriate permits, and the neighbors were complaining, so end of show. It was still a good party — lots of free food and drink and this crazy vaudeville troop on stilts performed. All in a day's work in the weird and wonderful world of show biz.

I've been been spending as much time as possible frolicking outdoors this summer, trying to clear my head and re-energize after two years spent mostly in planes, buses, studios, hotels and smoky clubs. Played lots of golf with Conrad Uno (Popllama Records guru and co-producer of our first record) and have spent some time in the mountains. The two highlights of my summer for me were climbing Mt. Hood and Mt. Adams, two of the Northwest's high volcanoes, and skiing from their summits. Before this rock and roll thing took off, I spent most of my free time climbing, skiing, fishing and such, so it's been great to get back out there.

Speaking of skiing, look for me in the fall '97 issue of Freeze, a new ski magazine. Also, I'm working with K2 skis and you can find me in the "Scene" section of their website @ www.k2ski.com.

Not much other news to speak of. We're headed for Australia in a few days, and I'm surprised to say that I'm completely psyched to tour again. It's great to be home, but I miss stepping out on stage and feeling the sparks fly between the three of us and the audience.
